## **Questions and Discussion:**

- 1. Why is there no condemnation according to Paul? Consider these passages: Romans 6:1-11 and Romans 7:1-6. Sin and the law no longer have power over us because we are what?
- 2. How important is our union with Christ's crucifixion, death, burial, resurrection, and new life? Romans 7:4
- 3. In Romans 7:13-25, Paul describes his life as a believer who struggles with sin. How does the truth of no condemnation inform our current struggle against sin?
- 4. We cannot be condemned because we are united to Christ. To condemn us, God would have to condemn his Son. How does this shape your view of justification?
- 5. In Romans 8:2-8, Paul explains why there is no condemnation. Read it and reflect on his reasoning.
- 6. Condemnation is the opposite of justification, or righteousness by faith, Romans 3:21-26 and 5:15-21. How does Paul communicate the meaning of justification?
- 7. Jean Valjean carried a yellow passport, a convict's passport, and could not escape his condemnation. What passport do you carry in Christ?
- 8. What did the Spirit communicate to you today? What did you learn?
